Stage 2 Birrigai Camp 29-30 November 2022

It's not long now before Stage 2 are off on camp!

Departure:

All students will need to arrive at school between 7.45am and 8.15am on Tuesday 29 November. Students will need to find their class teacher and have their name marked off when they arrive.

Due to our schedule at camp, the bus will leave promptly at 8.30am.

Arrival:

Our estimated arrival time back at school on Wednesday 30 November is 3.00pm. Teachers will use ClassDojo and Sentral messaging to update parents on the day.

Medication:

If your child needs to take any form of medication (other than asthma medication already at school) whilst on camp, please fill out the attached Permission to Administer Medication form (1 per medication). Please return to school ASAP, so our teachers can collate the information. On the morning of departure, any medication that is required to be administered at camp must be handed to teachers. **This medication must be in the original packaging with the prescription label with dosage instructions on it, sealed in a zip lock bag with your child's name clearly labelled on it.** Students are **not permitted** to keep medication in their personal bags during camp.

What to Pack: (see next page)

All students will be required to carry and transport their own bags during camp. To make the experience easier for your child, please pack all student belongings into ONE bag they can carry/pull by themselves. Please ensure every item being packed for camp is clearly labelled with your child's name. Please ensure you pack enough sets of clothes for 2 days. This will allow for spare clothes if students get wet.

Recommended Packing List


Two Day / One Night stay

- ☐ Warm sleeping bag or a quilt and bedsheet (**Birrigai does not provide blankets**)
- ☐ Pillow
- ☐ Drink bottle (**Birrigai does not provide water bottles**)

- Any food, including lollies, soft drink unless medically indicated
- iPods, phones or other electronic devices
- Expensive cameras
